**Registration Procedures**

For programs offered by the DRML you will register at DRML, for programs offered by the JTL you will register at JTL. Registration for preschoolers through grade 5 will begin at the JTL on Sat, June 18<sup>th</sup> 10:00 am and at the DRML on Fri, June 24<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 am. Sorry, we are unable to take phone signups on the first day of registration. You may register by phone after the first day. The first day of registration will be limited to those families living in Jericho and Underhill.

Registration for students currently in high school and middle school begins at both the DRML and JTL on Wed June 15<sup>th</sup> during our regularly scheduled hours.

**Registration is required for all programs unless otherwise indicated.** When registering please use the grade your child will be attending in the fall.

**PREREADERS** may pick up a **Read to Me Log** and keep track of the stories read to you. Each time you visit the library have your log stamped & your name will be entered into a drawing for a collection of books. Drawing July 29.
